In the last federal election, 61% of eligible voters cast a ballot. That's a frightening lack of interest by the electorate, but is nothing compared to the turnout in provincial and municipial elections, which show even lower turnouts. It's difficult to believe there's so little interest in elections. In Canada, we're fortunate to have polling stations within a short walk or drive. There are volunteers more than willing to provide rides to someone unable to walk or who doesn't have a car.
