What is our study about?

I would like to invite you to take part in a new research study. This study is part of a doctoral thesis at the University of York. Before you decide if you'd like to participate, I would like to take the chance to tell you a little more about this research.

Our study seeks to better understand your child's experience of growing up speaking a minority home language in England. We are looking at their personal experiences and the varying types of language support that may be available to them. We want to investigate how these may affect how well they are retaining their minority language.

How will your child take part in our study?

Your child is eligible for participating in our study. Taking part in this study is entirely voluntary and up to your child. Your child is free to withdraw from this study at any point they may wish to, with no penalty and no questions asked.

If you and your child choose to take part in our study, you will be provided with a written consent form, which you must sign before your child can take part. Once this has been signed, you will be sent a link to our study.

Your child will then take part in a short online survey (20 minutes). They will fill out a quick self-assessment about their home language skills, answer a few questions on their background, and then answer a few questions about their language use and experiences.

What will happen to the data that is gathered?

The data collected will remain entirely anonymous. If your child chooses to withdraw at any point, any data that had been collected until that point will be immediately destroyed. If your child chooses to take part in the study and then completes the survey, the data collected will be used in the publication of the doctoral thesis and will be completely anonymous.

What will happen to the results of the study?

The results will be published as part of a doctoral thesis at the University of York and may appear in an academic journal. If you would like to receive a copy of the thesis or a short summary, you may request this from the Principal Investigator. We will be very happy to provide you with one.



Why should your child participate in this study?

Your child's responses will help us better understand how we can improve support for lookedafter children who speak a minority home language. By learning about their experiences, we hope to find ways to make home language support more available, understand their specific needs, and raise awareness of bilingualism with professionals in social work.

Are there any risks?

There are no physical risks to taking part in this research. This study addresses growing up with a minority home language and may address foster care or adoption. We would advise you to discuss with your child how they feel about this and ask them if they feel comfortable answering questions on this topic. If your child experiences any psychological distress while filling out the survey, then they are free to stop immediately with no penalty.

Who has reviewed this study?

This study has been reviewed by the University of York and University of Essex Ethics Committees and has been granted full ethical approval. The research is currently being supervised by Professor Monika Schmid, Head of Department, in the Department of Language and Linguistic science at the University of York.
